The Apostles' Creed: "I believe... He descended to the dead. The third day He arose from the dead."

"The descent clause, at the very least, affirms that Jesus experienced death as all humans do, with his body ceasing to function and his soul departing to the place of the dead. It also affirms, via affirming Jesus' human soul departing to the place of the dead, that Jesus was really and truly dead, not just in a coma."

"After Jesus died on the cross and His body was buried in the tomb, where was He? This short statement in the creed reminds us that Jesus, having truly died, was in what both the Old and New Testaments describe as the realm of the dead. The Hebrew word from the Old Testament is Sheol, and the Greek word from the New Testament is Hades. In both cases this refers to the temporary realm of the dead who are awaiting final judgment."

I Corinthians 15:1-4

Big Idea of this Series: The Apostles' Creed is a concise summary of the main points of the Christian faith and will help us avoid and correct error and be strengthened and matured in our faith.

Big Idea of Today's Message: Jesus experienced death as all humans do. His body was buried and His soul departed to the place of the dead, from which He arose on the third day.

A chronology of events.

Defining terms.

What this does not mean.

What this must mean.

"I believe in God, the Father Almighty, the Maker of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord: Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; **He descended to the dead. The third day He arose again from the dead;** He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy Christian church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen."
