I Corinthians 15:1-4

The Apostles' Creed – "I believe in Jesus Christ... who was crucified, dead, and buried..."

Big Idea of this Series: The Apostles' Creed is a concise summary of the main points of the Christian faith and will help us avoid and correct error and be strengthened and matured in our faith.

Big Idea of Today's Message: The three central truths confirmed here affirm the fact that Jesus was crucified on a cross by the act of scornful men, that He truly died, and that after His death His body was buried – all of this in perfect fulfillment of the plan of God.

Jesus Christ was crucified for our sins according to the Scriptures.

Jesus Christ truly died.

Jesus Christ was buried.
