Expect Opposition to God's Work, Part 3 Ezra 4:4-24

Big Truth of this Series: God is working to glorify Himself in His
people through restoration, revival, and repentance.

Big Truth of Today's Message: When the world cannot infiltrate and pollute your worship of and work for God, it will openly oppose and hinder your obedience and growth.

The world openly opposes God and His people. We must stand and not yield to discouragement, fear, and frustration (v. 4-5).

The world will persistently, relentlessly, and increasingly oppose God and His people. We must obey God rather than man (vv. 6-23).

Unfortunately, sometimes God's people are intimidated into temporarily stopping God's work. Jesus promised that He would finish building His church (v. 24).
