Sleepless in Susa: "It Just So Happened..."

Esther 6:1-14

Big Truth of this Series: God is always working behind the scenes in every detail of life to accomplish His redemptive purposes.

Big Truth of Today's Message: The pivotal point in the story of Esther that led to a reversal of an evil plot against God's people was that it "just so happened" that the king had a sleepless night.

- It just so happened that the king couldn't sleep (6:1a).
- It just so happened that he chose to read a history book (6:1b).
- It just so happened that the servants read the story of Mordecai saving the king (6:1c-3).
- It just so happened that Haman was in the right (wrong?) place at the right (wrong?) time (6:4-11).
- It just so happened that Haman discovered (too late) that you cannot successfully oppose God's people (6:12-14).
