Big Truth of this Series: God is always working behind the scenes in every detail of life to accomplish His redemptive purposes.

Big Truth of Today's Message: Esther steps up! She not only identifies herself with and seeks mercy for her people, she also reveals wicked Haman and his evil plot.

Queen Esther, believing that she is where she is for "such a time as this,"
 continues to unfold her well-woven plan (7:1).

- Queen Esther asks for mercy for herself and her people, and confronts wicked Haman and his murderous plot to destroy them (7:2-6).

- Haman receives the king's wrath and the retribution due him (7:7-10).
