Esther 8:1-17

Big Truth of this Series: God is always working behind the scenes in every detail of life to accomplish His redemptive purposes.

Big Truth of Today's Message: In the darkness of the irrevocable decree of death for all lews, Mordecai and Esther create a counter-decree that brings great joy to the people.

-The king gives Esther a gift and Mordecai a promotion (8:1-2).

- No way out! Evil Haman's decree of death is irrevocable (8:3-8).

- Deliverance through Mordecai's new decree of life instead of death (8:9-14).

- Great fear and sadness is turned into great joy and celebration (8:15-17).
