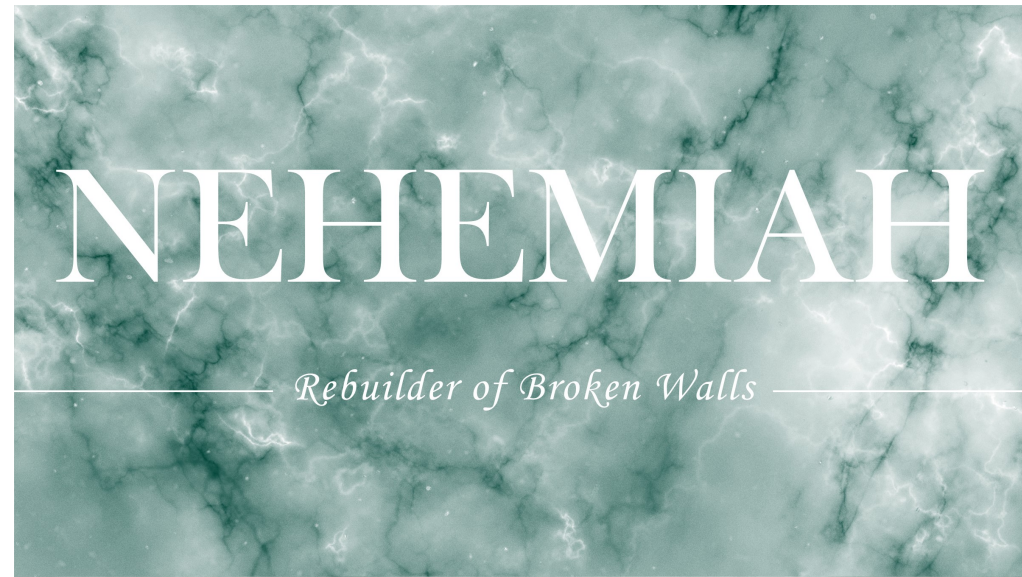
Wednesday PM Classes on March 16 are cancelled due to spring break. However, the choir and orchestra will meet from 6:30-7:30pm.

Nehemiah 1:1-11

Big Truth of this Series: God is working to glorify Himself by sending a deliverer to rebuild our broken walls and call us to worship and obedience in the face of opposition.

Big Truth of Today's Message: God stirred the heart of His servant with a deep concern for His reputation among His people and a desire to pray about that concern. Nehemiah beautifully pictures the work of Christ.

Why study the book of Nehemiah?

Who are the main characters of this story?

How do God's people get themselves into such messes? (1:1-3)

What is the proper heart-response to the shameful state of God's people? (1:4)

A concerned and confessional plea to God for restoration of God's people. (1:5-11)
