The Lord’s Supper will be observed **November 20** during the worship service. We do this in remembrance of the Lord, and thus proclaim His death until He comes.



Grace Greater Than Our Sin

Grace Abounding to the Chief of Sinners

1 Timothy 1:12-17

Big Truth of this Series: God has commissioned the people of God, the church, to be grounded in sound doctrine and to live in a godly manner according to the truth.

Big Truth of Today’s Message: We, like Paul, should be stunned that God would use us in His kingdom work and, like Paul, we should be stunned by God’s grace shown to sinners like us.

¹² I thank Him who has given me strength, Christ Jesus our Lord, because He judged me faithful, appointing me to His service, ¹³ though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy because I acted ignorantly and in unbelief,

¹⁴ and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus.

¹⁵ The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost.

¹⁶ But I received mercy for this reason, that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display His perfect patience as an example to those who were to believe in Him for eternal life.

¹⁷ To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.
