

I Timothy 1:18-20**

Big Truth of this Series: God has commissioned the people of God, the church, to be grounded in sound doctrine and to live in a godly manner according to the truth.

Big Truth of Today's Message: As spiritual soldiers and sailors, we are to fight the good warfare and avoid shipwreck by holding firmly to the faith and a good conscience.

¹⁸ This charge I entrust to you, Timothy, my child, in accordance with the prophecies previously made about you, that by them you may wage the good warfare,

¹⁹ holding faith and a good conscience.

By rejecting this, some have made shipwreck of their faith, ²⁰ among whom are Hymenaeus and Alexander,

whom I have handed over to Satan that they may learn not to blaspheme.
