Fill Your Cup, July 22, 9:30-11:00am in the Café is the next Women’s Coffee. Darise Hails will be sharing words of encouragement.

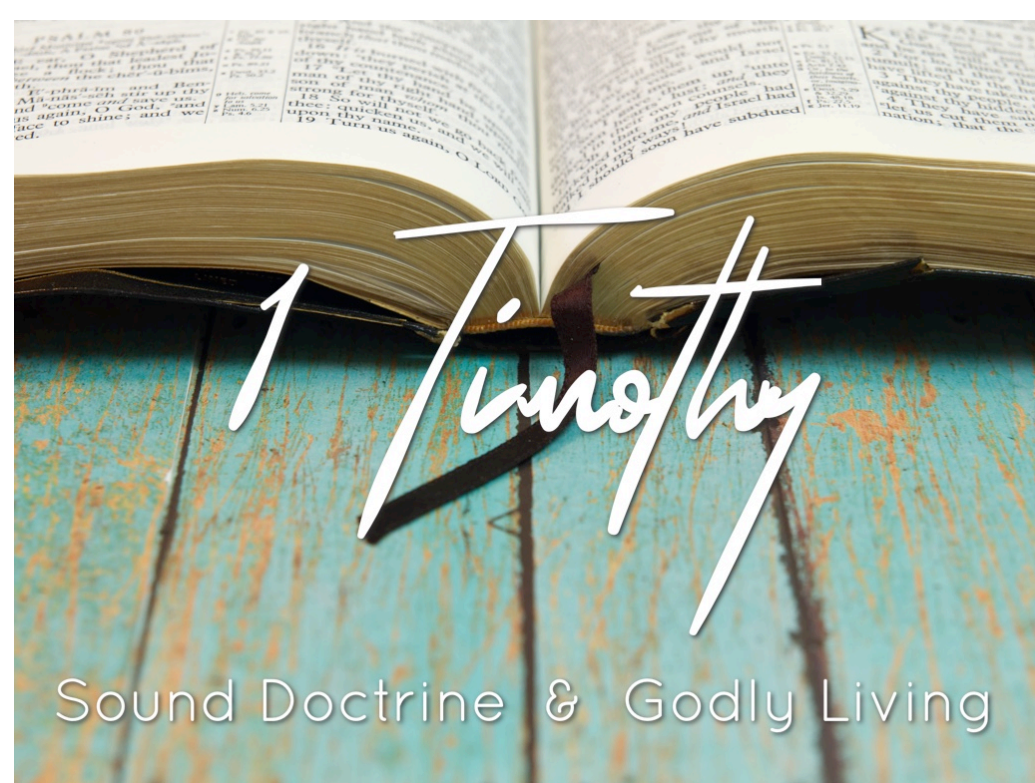

“Several times the idea is put forth: never work for men, you Christians; work only for God. You can work under a person’s direction, but remember that you are working unto the Lord, that your daily task is work that He has given you to do, and you do it unto Him. What a glory this gives to every task. If you approach your work like this, you will never have another dull day. You will never be bored stiff with the routine and humdrum of what you have to do if you recognize that you are doing it with the eye of the Lord upon you and with the recognition that one day it will be made open and clear to all whether you did it as unto the Lord or unto men.” ~Ray Stedman

“The Christian faith does not bring about harmony by erasing social or cultural distinctions. Servants are still servants when they trust Christ, and masters are still masters. Rather, the Christian faith brings harmony by working in the heart. Christ gives us a new motivation, not a new organization. Both servant and master are serving the Lord and seeking to please Him, and in this way they are able to work together to the glory of God.” ~Warren Wiersbe

“Most people work to earn a living, attain success, or amass wealth. Such reasons, however, must not be the Christian’s primary motive for working. What gives work eternal value is not the product or service or our labor but the process of laboring itself – doing the job faithfully to the glory of the Lord. God commands us to work because it is good. But work also gives believers the opportunity to represent Jesus Christ to unbelievers. By performing our God-given tasks to the best of our abilities, we bring honor and glory to His name. And we demonstrate to fellow employees the difference Christ can make in a life. Is our daily work just a job? Or are we doing it to the glory of God?”

Practical Encouragement for the Church Family, Part 5

I Timothy 6:1-2

Big Truth of this Series: God has commissioned the people of God, the church, to be grounded in sound doctrine and to live in a godly manner according to His truth.

Big Truth of Today’s Message: Sound doctrine is always intensely practical, yielding godly living in how we glorify God in the workplace.

“Let all who are under a yoke as slaves regard their own masters as worthy of all honor;” (6:1a)

“so that the name of God and the teaching may not be reviled.” (6:1b)

“Those who have believing masters must not be disrespectful on the ground that they are brothers;” (6:2a)

“rather they must serve all the better since those who benefit by their good service are believers and beloved. Teach and urge these things.” (6:2b)
