

Instructing, Protecting, Discerning, Part 3 Titus 1:1-16

Big Truth of this Series: With the saints through the ages, we share a common faith in gospel doctrine that inspires gospel duty and gospel duty that adorns gospel doctrine.

Big Truth of Today's Message: Jesus used the metaphor of sheep and goats to describe people who would populate not only the world, but also each local church. We must learn to discern the differences between sheep and goats.

In the world and in the church, there are only two kinds of people. Romans 1:25

Sheep believe in and know the Shepherd. Goats profess to know Him but do not believe in and do not know the **Shepherd.** Titus 1:13 and Titus 1:15b

Sheep are being purified and practice good works. Goats have an appearance of godliness but are defiled and are unfit for any good work. Titus 2:14a and Titus 1:15

Sheep hold to God's Word. Goats contradict God's Word. Titus 1:9a and Titus 1:9b-10

Sheep will go into eternal kingdom prepared for them. Goats will go into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. Titus 3:7 and Titus 3:11; Matthew 25:31-46
