# Not Why, But Who

## Book of Job

- **A finite being must not call into question an Infinite God.**
- **We do not worship creation; creation is revealing the Creator we are to worship.**
- **Job asked questions God could answer, God asked questions Job couldn't. Job's response should have been, “Not me, You!”**
- **No matter your view of God, He is still greater! Never be satisfied with your view of God.**
- **No matter your view of your godliness, you still need continual confession, repentance and growth in godliness.**
- **God didn't give Job a reason for his suffering; God gave him a Revelation of Himself.**
