
"Neighborhoods to the Nations" Giving Emphasis - During the month of November please prayerfully consider how you might help spread the gospel from Neighborhoods to Nations by giving to various ministries and missionaries. Two opportunities are highlighted below.

<u>Neighborhoods</u>: As winter approaches, many homeless in OKC will need physical protection from the elements—and even more, they need the good news of the Gospel. We would like to fill 200 drawstring backpacks with needed items to bring physical comfort, along with a Bible and "The Life Book" to minister to their spiritual needs. The backpacks will be distributed by City Care Night Shelter. You can help by giving to HBC and indicating "Missions Fund" in the memo line/note.

<u>Nations</u>: Every year, with your help, Harvest Evangelistic Association puts together 20,000 Christmas backpacks, loaded with school supplies, toys, cookies, and a beautiful gospel booklet. Over 400 native pastors are trained and equipped to use the backpacks to reach their entire community with the Gospel. Difficult Times and People in the Church - Part 2

II Timothy 3:1-5

Big Truth of this Series: The apostle Paul encourages and warns Timothy and all believers to follow, entrust, and be always ready to proclaim God's Word with confidence and joy as days of difficulty lie ahead.

Big Truth of Today's Message: We must understand that the last days will bring times of difficulty in the form of difficult people, opposers of the truth, who will be lovers of self, lovers of money, and lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God.

v. 1 – "But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty."

v. 2a, 4b – "For people will be lovers of self...

lovers of money...

lovers of pleasure...

rather than lovers of God..."
